Murals have become a unique and appealing way of increasing tourism and improving commerce. Clark County Mural Society has been working toward a vision of artistic identity and cultural richness in Vancouver, Washington since 2004. We currently have thirteen murals to date, with a much larger vision.

Our goal is to become one of the key mural destinations for tourism on the West Coast. In the next five years, through the annual Summer of Murals competition and other mural projects, we plan to bring Vancouver's number of murals to over 100. Mural destinations boast increased tourism which results in significant tax revenues.

CCMS has developed a project plan that will coordinate and promote public mural art through an annual festival speeding us toward our goal, while it brings the community together around art. Through the organized efforts of the Clark County Mural Society, this program will rely on corporate sponsors, grant and private funding as well as public participation and community involvement.

Please join us in pictorially preserving and celebrating the art, history and culture of Vancouver while increasing the charm and character of our city for residents and visitors alike. We will take pride in:

- **Promoting economic development by increasing tourism, business and tax revenues, and property values**
- **Inspiring and energizing our town and uniting our community, organized groups, and businesses by encouraging participation from all ages and walks of life**
- **Beautifying our streets while decreasing vandalism and eliminating graffiti**
- **Creating a greater appreciation of the visual arts and our historical roots while establishing the face and identity of Vancouver, Washington.**

ARTIST Expectations

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The CCMS Task Force has recruited property owners in Downtown Vancouver, rapidly becoming the Arts & Entertainment District of the community, to allow the usage of 6 outdoor walls on their properties for 6 murals. Each will tell a special Vancouver story, beautify the environment and help build Vancouver as a "destination location".

Statistics show that tourism monies spent on arts & cultural activities exceed those spent on sports activities, demonstrating that the Summer of Murals project will contribute to the health of the Vancouver economy. Certainly a part of that contribution is the prize monies given to the competition winners:

The future mural walk will begin at 3rd and Columbia Streets and grow throughout downtown up to Fourth Plain. Please see the attached map of our progress as we envision your building's position in this tour.

Your responsibilities will be:

- Sign a contract with CCMS
- Fill Out W-9
- Adhere to rules and procedures outlined in the Artist Rules Packet and those additionally added by building owners.
- Complete project awarded by CCMS in designated timeline periods.
- Allow us to provide identification and promotional wall painting

Our responsibilities are:

- Planning and deployment of the Summer of Murals competition
- Providing support during process
- Lesion between suppliers, artist, and building owners
- Future maintenance and upkeep of the mural

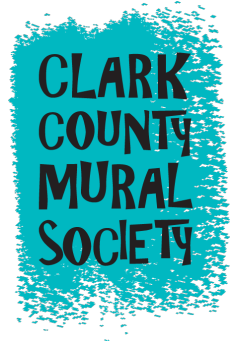
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2016 ARTIST Murals and Timeline

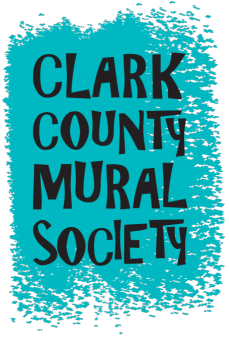

Further, in consideration for participating in the Summer of Murals contest, I voluntarily agree to assume all the risks involved in participating in the Summer of Murals contest. I understand that by participating in this contest I expose myself to the risk of injuries including, but not limited to, temporary or permanent muscle soreness, sprains, strains, cuts, abrasions, bruises, head or neck injuries, loss of use of eyes or limbs, or death. I also recognize that there are foreseeable and unforeseeable risks of injury or death that may occur as a result of my participation in the contest. Therefore, I hereby release the promoters and sponsors of this event, including, but not limited to, the City of Vancouver, CCMS, all municipalities special districts, properties, or their respective officers, agents, representatives, employees, successors and/or assigns from any and all liability, claims, costs, expenses, injuries or losses including those resulting from any acts of negligence by any of the parties noted above that I may sustain as a result of my participation in the contest.

Purpose of Form

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN), individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Form 1099-INT (interest earned or paid)
- Form 1099-DIV (dividends, including those from stocks or mutual funds)
- Form 1099-MISC (various types of income, prizes, awards, or gross proceeds)
- Form 1099-B (stock or mutual fund sales and certain other transactions by brokers)
- Form 1099-S (proceeds from real estate transactions)
- Form 1099-K (merchant card and third party network transactions)

- Form 1098 (home mortgage interest), 1098-E (student loan interest), 1098-T (tuition)
- Form 1099-C (canceled debt)
- Form 1099-A (acquisition or abandonment of secured property)

If you do not return Form W-9 to the requester with a TIN, you might be subject to backup withholding. See What is backup withholding? on page 2.

By signing the filled-out form, you:
